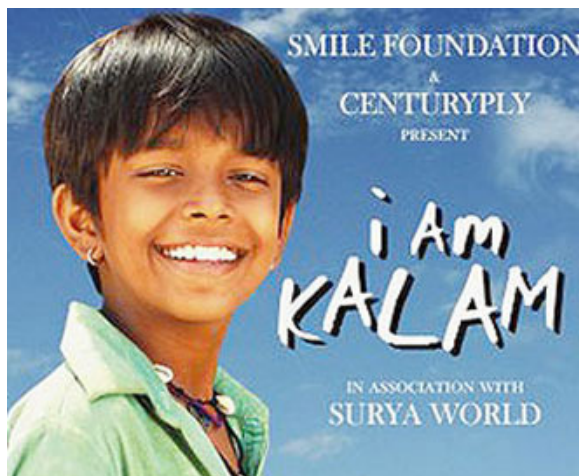

I AM KALAM is the story of a very poor, young Indian boy's hunger for education. He cannot go to school because he has to work in his uncle's roadside restaurant to help support his mother and baby sister. One day he sees a TV clip of the former president of India, Dr. A.P.J. Kalam speak on how he got his education fighting several odds. From that point on, the young boy insists everyone call him Kalam. The film celebrates the survival of the human spirit against overwhelming odds.

The Bluegrass Indo-American Civic Society (BIACS) is providing support for the film showings and will host a reception in Conference A in the Library between the two showings. The Library is arranging a special display of books about India and by Indian authors.
